

How to reach Jaipur



Jaipur International Airport located in Sanganer, 11 kms from the city. There are direct flights to major Indian cities like Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkatta, Bangalore, Udaipur, Jodhpur, Aurangabad and there are International flights to Sharjah, Abu Dhabi, Dubai & Muscat.



Jaipur is connected to New Delhi and all main cities in India from Delhi. Palace on Wheels is the most well known train mainly used by tourists. Other important trains include Shatabdi Express, Jaipur-Delhi double decker and Pink City Express both from Delhi.



Jaipur is well connected to all the major cities around the state of Rajasthan. The National Highway No. 8 links Delhi-Mumbai via Jaipur, Udaipur. National Highway No. 12 links Jaipur-Jabalpur via Kota, Jhalawar, Bhopal and National Highway No. 11 links Agra-Bikaner via Jaipur.

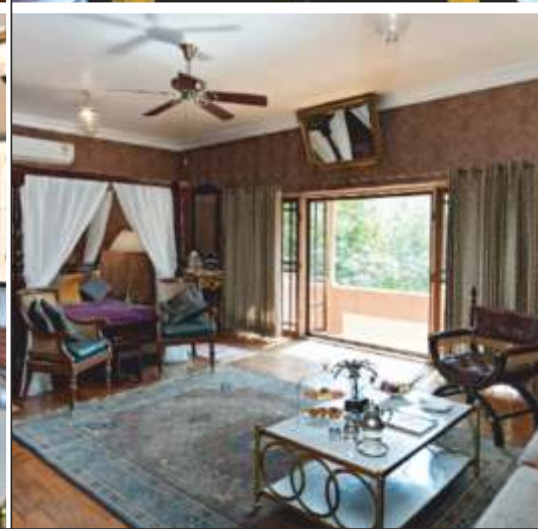
ROYAL SUITES

Discover the 'Pink City'

AMER FORT

Take a trip to Amer Fort, perched high on a hill on the outskirts of the Pink City. Founded by Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II in 1727, it was once Jaipur's capital. Every night, it hosts a light and sound show that illuminates the red sandstone fort and its stately grounds.

HAWA MAHAL

Hawa Mahal or the Palace of Winds, a beehive-shaped red and pink sandstone structure which shelters airy courtyards, stands in the middle of the city on a crowded street.

NAHARGARH FORT

Nahargarh Fort, or the "Viger Fort", stands above the city on a hill, and has a maze of bedrooms and an incredible collection of old murals. It once formed the defense ring of the kingdom, along with Amer Fort.

THE DEEPEST STEP-WELL IN THE WORLD!

A two-hour drive from Jaipur leads you to the architectural marvel of Chand Baori named after King Chanda who commissioned the construction of the well between the 8th and 9th century.

CAMEL DESERT RIDE

The ships of desert, camels, are marvelous creatures that will enable you to discover some of the beautiful and relatively unexplored regions of Rajasthan.

JHALANA LEOPARD SAFARI

Jhalana Safari park in Jaipur is the famous park for Leopard Jhalana Nature Park is a 700+ hectare reserve forest area that is open to visitors for bird watching and jeep safaris. More than 200+ varieties of birds, 450+ plant species have been recorded here and is home around 14 to 15 leopards.
